### Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis plans to establish a militia that answers solely to him

■lorida Gov. Ron DeSantis introduced a budget proposal on Thursday that includes plans to establish a militia that would answer solely to him.

Unlike the Florida National Guard, the Florida State Guard wouldn't receive federal funding or embark on federal missions.

DeSantis wants to use \$3.5 million of the \$100 million budget proposal to fund the state guard he said will "not be encumbered to the federal government."

The guard, made up of up to 200 volunteers, would support the Florida National Guard during state emergencies, the propos-

the Florida State Guard will enable civilians to be trained in the best emergency response techniques. By establishing the Florida State Guard, Florida will become the 23rd state with a state guard recognized by the federal government."

DeSantis' proposal isn't completely outside of the norm. There are 22 states who currently have defense forces independent from the National Guard.

However, DeSantis' track record, including violently quelling protesters has some Democrats sounding the alarm over the governor's plan.

"No Governor should have his own handpicked secret police," said Rep. Charlie Crist, who represents Florida's 13th District in

### **Omicron variant was in Europe before** South Africa sounded alarm

utch health authorities announced on Tuesday that they found the new Omicron variant of the coronavirus in cases dating back as long as 11 days, indicating that it was already spreading in western Europe before the first cases were identified in southern Africa. The RIVM health institute said it found Omicron in samples dating from November 19 and 23.

Those findings predate the positive cases found among passengers who came from South Africa last Friday and were tested at Amsterdam's Schiphol airport.

"It is not yet clear whether the people concerned [in the earlier cases] have also been to southern Africa," the RIVM said, adding that the individuals had been informed of their Omicron infections and that local health services had started contact tracing.

"In the coming period, various studies will be conducted into the distribution of the Omicron variant in the Netherlands," the institute said, noting that it would also re-examine more samples from previous COVID test results.

Belgium and Germany have also said that sample tests confirm the variant was in those countries before South African health officials alerted the world on November 24 to its existence.

new variant and alerting global health authorities to it last week. But Omicron has now spread to about 20 other countries, and amid mounting concern that it could be significantly easier to pass from person to person, and that it could have at least some resistance to current treatments and vaccines, many nations have imposed travel restrictions on passengers from southern African nations.

South African politicians and scientists have said they feel as though they're being punished for their advanced COVID-19 screening program, which caught the variant and enabled other nations to respond quickly to it, but has resulted in the travel bans which largely target southern African nations.

Japan and France confirmed their first cases of the new variant on Tuesday as countries around the world scrambled to close their doors, and scientists raced to test existing drugs against it.

In November, Ashley Etienne, who served as Vice President Harris' communications director, also stepped down. Prominent news reports suggested major issues between the White House and Vice President Harris' staff, but officials have dismissed such claims.

The daughter of Omaha Star Publisher Terri Sanders, Symone Sanders earned acclaim as "a

champion for women."

A seasoned political strategist, Sanders gained national prominence in 2016 as the National Press Secretary for U.S. Sen. Bernie Sanders' then-presidential campaign.

At 25, she became the youngest presidential press secretary on record and was named to Rolling Stone Magazine's list of 16 young Americans shaping the 2016 election.

Sanders also worked as the principal of the 360 Group LLC, providing strategic communications guidance to organizations, businesses, individuals, campaigns and candidates and helps clients find sound solutions to tough political and social prob-

According to her biography, Sanders counts as "a communicator with a passion for juvenile justice," and served as the former chair of the Coalition of Juvenile Justice Emerging Leaders Committee and former member of the Federal Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice.

She worked diligently to raise the profile of young voices in the fight for juvenile justice reform and bring millennial perspectives



to policy conversations.

Sanders, 31, once worked as a political commentator for CNN and served in 2018 and 2019 as a resident fellow at Harvard's Institute of Politics at the Kennedy School and the University of Southern California's Center for the Political Future respectively.

'Symone has been working at the highest levels and in an extraordinarily intense environment for three years for Joe Biden and now Vice President Harris," Anita Dunn, a former top aide to President Joe Biden, said in a televised interview this week.

"When you look at the three years, two on the campaign, one in the White House, nobody can question her decision that she needs a break and it's time to move on. And she'll always be a member of the Biden-Harris family," Dunn asserted.

### Muslim lawmakers condemn Republicans' inaction after Boebert's Islamophobic remarks

eps. Ilhan Omar (D-Minn.), Rashida Tlaib (D-Mich.) and André Carson (D-Ind.) came together to condemn Republican lawmakers' inaction after Rep. Lauren Boebert's (R-Colo.) repeated Islamophobic remarks against Omar.

"When a sitting member of Congress calls a colleague a member of the 'jihad squad' and falsifies a story to suggest I will blow up the Capitol, it is not just an attack on me but on millions of American Muslims across this country," Omar said Tuesday at a news conference demanding accountability from Republican House leadership.

In late November, Boebert joked to a crowd about Omar be-



ing a suicide bomber, referring to the Muslim lawmaker as the "jihad squad." And in September, Boebert suggested Omar was a terrorist at another event, saying: "She doesn't have a backpack, she wasn't dropping it and running, so we're good."

"Condemning this should not be a partisan issue," Omar said Tuesday. "This is about our basic humanity and fundamental rights of religious freedom enshrined in our Constitution."

Omar urged Republican Party leaders to "hold their members accountable" and "do something to confront anti-Muslim hatred in its ranks"

### African Americans, Democrats say they still support BLM movement

ollowing a recent poll that showed support for the Black Lives Matter Movement waning, conversations have commenced over the continued relevancy of the campaign.

Researchers conducted by the national polling site, Civiqs revealed that 44 percent of Americans support the Black Lives Matter Movement, while 43 percent said they oppose the campaign.

Approximately 11 percent of respondents reported that they neither support nor oppose the campaign, which began in 2012 in response to a jury's decision to acquit George Zimmerman in the shooting death of Trayvon Martin.

However, hidden in the details of the poll are subgroups that show the movement still enjoys the overall support of African Americans and Democrats.

Eighty-two percent of African Americans said they support the campaign, while just 7 percent oppose. While 60 percent of Hispanic/ Latinos still support the Black Lives Matter Movement, 51 percent of white Americans oppose.

Just 3 percent of who identify as Republican support the movement, and 86 percent oppose. Democrat respondents support the campaign by an 86 percent to 4 percent margin.

The movement's support appeared to peak in the wake of the police murder of George Floyd as global protests joined in the cry of Black Lives Matter.

Black Lives Matter Global Network Foundation co-founder Patrisse Cullors resigned earlier this year following allegations she parlayed her part in the movement into a multi-million-dollar lifestyle that included purchasing several properties in various locations.

Shortly before Cullors' resignation, the foundation released a 2020 Impact Report that claimed it had raised more than \$90 million. Reportedly, 10 Black Lives Matter chapter leaders called for financial transparency and an independent investigation into spending funds. In addition, EBONY reported that the claims of "financial impropriety were a source of constant concern for several parents whose children had been killed by police in controversial shootings."

EBONY cited Tamika Palmer, whose daughter Breonna Taylor was killed by Louisville police as she slept in her home. Samaria Rice, whose 12-year-old son Tamir, was killed on a playground by a Cleveland police officer.

Each has come out publicly and denounced the Black Lives

Matter foundation and accused the organization of raising money off the blood of their children.

Michael Brown Sr., whose son Michael was walking home from a store unarmed and killed by a police officer in Ferguson, Missouri, called for Black Lives Matter to donate \$20 million to non-profit organizations in Ferguson that are working to empower residents in exchange for the millions of dollars they raised in using his son's name and image.

Cullors has countered that all the financial purchases she has made have come from her income, including a multi-year television deal with Warner Brothers, a book deal, speaking engagements, and consulting services.

Entertainer Tyrone Evans Clarke said during protests he participated in following Floyd's murder, and he noticed many individuals willing to make sacrifices for the cause.

"It seems the U.S. doesn't respect Black and Brown people's lives," Clarke stated.

"Cops were attacking peaceful protestors with tear gas and rubber bullets, and that didn't help. On top of that, look how long it took to put Floyd's murderer behind bars. It feels like there is a knee on our necks every day just by being Black," he said.



## Stacey Abrams governor run provides a jolt for the 2022 midterms

n an announcement that has provided a jolt to the 2022 midterm elections, Stacey Abrams said she's running for governor of the Peach State.

The race, which could mean a second dual between Abrams and Republican Gov. Brian Kemp, promises to catapult Democrats into the position of favorites.

A Democrat and noted voting rights advocate, Abrams lost to Kemp by just over one percentage point in their controversial 2018 battle.

Her activism helped Democrats claim the majority in the U.S. Senate when Georgia Democrats Raphael Warnock and Jon Ossoff defeated Republicans Kelly Loeffler and David Perdue in the January 2021 runoff election.

"I'm running because opportunity in our state shouldn't be determined by zip code, background, or access to power," Abrams declared.

"That<sup>i</sup>s the job of the governor – to fight for one Georgia, our Georgia," Abrams exclaimed. "And now, it is time to get the job done."

Abrams's work since her 2018 loss to Kemp has received praise across the political spectrum. In 2019, she launched Fair Count and Fair Fight Action to encourage voter participation in elections and educate voters about elections and their voting rights.

The PAC brings awareness to the public on election reform, advocates for election reform at all levels, and engages in other voter education programs and communications.

"Voter suppression, particularly of voters of color and young

voters, is a scourge our country faces in states across the nation," Abrams noted on her website.

She said Georgia's 2018 elections "shone a bright light on the issue with elections that were rife with mismanagement, irregularities, unbelievably long lines and more, exposing both recent and also decades-long actions and inactions by the state to thwart the right to vote."

"Fair Fight Action was founded to organize collective efforts to expose, mitigate, and reverse voter suppression. We engage in voter mobilization and education activities and advocate for progressive issues," Abrams continued.

Fair Fight PAC has initiated programs to support voter protection programs at state parties around the country and is engaging in partnerships to support and elect pro-voting rights progressive leaders.

# Suspect in fatal shooting of Jacqueline Avant charged with murder

police found Clarence Avant cradling the head of Jackie, his wife of 54 years, who later died at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center.

Aariel Maynor, the man accused of killing Jacqueline Avant last week in her home during a botched home invasion, has officially been charged with her murder.

Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascón is also charging Maynor, 29, with attempted murder for firing at a security guard inside Avant's Trousdale Estates, Calif., home, according to The Los Angeles Times.

"Mrs. Avant was a treasured member of our community. Her generosity and goodwill touched so many lives," Gascón said Monday. "My office is working closely with the Los Angeles and Beverly Hills police departments in the investigation and prosecution of this case. We must continue to work together to hold accountable the people who commit violent crimes against our community."

More details emerged in the

### **Woods shut down questions** about his car crash in first public appearance since accident

liger Woods made his first public appearance since his single-car accident in February and refused to answer any questions related to the crash.

On Tuesday, Woods appeared for a press conference at the Albany Golf Club in Nassau, Bahamas and spoke on his healing process over the last nine months. The golf champion made it clear that he wanted to put any reminder of the February 23 crash behind him, NY Post reports.

"This year is a year I'd like to turn the page on," Woods said.

When asked what he remembered about the accident, the first place PGA tour winner shut down the prying and let it be known that he would not be reliving the traumatic experience.

Woods suffered multiple injuries to his leg due to the "highspeed" single-car crash that took place just outside Los Angeles earlier this year. At the time, Woods had to undergo extensive surgery that included stabilizing his leg by inserting a rod into the tibia, Golf Digest reports. Screws and pins were also used to stabilize the bones in Wood's foot and ankle.

During the press conference, Woods explained how challenging the recovery process has been for him and all the work he still has

"This one's been much more difficult," Woods said. "The knee stuff that I had on my left knee ... those operations were one thing, that's one level. Then you add the back, that's another level. And then with this right leg, that was .. it's hard to explain how difficult it has been just to be immobile for the three months, just lay there tion, so you can read about all that and I was just looking forward to getting outside."





### Mostly white jury chosen for Kim Potter trial in the death of Daunte Wright

mostly white jury has been chosen in the trial of former Minnesota Officer Kim Potter over the shooting death of Daunte Wright. Although split evenly by gender, nine jurors are white, two are Asian and only one is Black, all ranging in age from their 20s to 60s.

According to USA Today, the jurors had to answer a question-naire before being chosen. All the jurors answered that they knew of the case because of media coverage and many said that they had already seen the body camera footage. Five jurors said they had a negative view of both Potter and Wright.

Daunte Wright was fatally shot and killed during a traffic stop in a Minneapolis suburb after Potter says she mistakenly used her gun instead of her taser on April 11. Potter resigned two days after the shooting. She was charged with first and second degree manslaughter.

According to NBC News, Minnesota's sentencing guidelines call for minimums of over seven years for first-degree manslaughter and four years for second degree manslaughter, but prosecutors said they're looking for heftier sentences.

The defense used all five of their peremptory challenges, which means they can dismiss a juror without reason, and the state used all of three of theirs.

The defense on Thursday used one of its peremptory challenges to dismiss a first-year law student who has made com-

ments on social media about cases in which police officers have been convicted. Such challenges cannot be made solely because of a person's race, ethnicity or gender, and prosecutor Matthew Frank objected to the dismissal of the law student, an Asian woman.

Judge Regina Chu dismissed Frank's objection, ruling there was no evidence that the defense strike was based on race or gender.

One of the jurors seated the first day was recalled for questioning Thursday after Chu said he had expressed concerns that his identity was revealed when he was first questioned. The jury is anonymous by order of the judge. The man remained on the jury after he told Chu he was willing to continue serving.

# Mother of accused Michigan school shooter praised President Trump for stance on gun rights in 2016 blog post

he mother of a sophomore student accused of opening fire inside his Michigan high school previously wrote an open letter to former President Donald Trump praising his support for the Second Amendment.

Ethan Crumbley on Wednesday was charged as an adult with two dozen crimes — including murder, attempted murder and terrorism causing death — in connection with the massacre inside Oxford High School. Authorities said the attack unfolded over the course of just five minutes Tuesday afternoon, during which four people were fatally shot and seven more wounded.


Tate Myre, 16; Madisyn Bald-

win, 17; Hana St. Juliana, 14, and Justin Shilling, 17, were left dead in wake of the shooting.

The weapon used to carry out the violence, a 9-mm semi-automatic handgun, was legally purchased just days earlier by the 15-year-old's father during a Black Friday shopping trip. His family is seemingly adamant supporters of the right to possess firearms and guns, evidenced by a blog post uncovered by the Daily Beast reportedly written by Crumbley's mother about Trump.

"As a female and a Realtor, thank you for allowing my right to bear arms. Allowing me to be protected if I show a home to someone with bad intentions," she wrote in November 2016. "Thank you respecting that Amendment."




Mars and .Paak released their

### Barbados officially declares Rihanna a national hero

The prime minister then referenced Rihanna's 2012 song "Diamonds," telling the singer: "May you continue to shine like a diamond, and bring honor to your nation, by your words, by your actions and to do credit wherever you shall go."

Rihanna, whose full name is Robyn Rihanna Fenty, was born in the St. Michael parish in Barbados. Over the years, the country has celebrated and recognized the extraordinary influence and philanthropy of the nine-time Grammy Award winner.






