

FBI raids Donald Trump's resort in **Florida**

he FBI on Monday executed a search warrant of former President Donald Trump's Mar-a-Lago resort in Palm Beach, Florida.

"My beautiful home, Mar-A-Lago in Palm Beach, Florida, is currently under siege, raided, and occupied by a large group of FBI agents,"Trump said in a statement first sent to CNN.

It wasn't immediately clear what the FBI was looking for and what spurred the raid.

However, the Department of Justice recently acknowledged it had launched an investigation into Trump's actions leading up to Jan. 6.

Multiple outlets cited several individuals familiar with the investigation in their reports.

The outlets noted that prosecutors had asked witnesses before a grand jury about conversations with Trump.

"Some of the questions focused on substituting Trump allies for electors in states President Joe Biden won and on a pressure campaign on then-Vice President Mike Pence to overturn the election," the Washington Post reported earlier this month.

The newspaper said the Justice Department obtained aides' telephone records, including former Trump chief of staff Mark Meadows.

The Department of Justice, a Trump spokesperson, and a lawyer for Meadows did not respond to requests for comment.

In a NBC Nightly News inter-



view last week, U.S. Attorney Genhusband, Jared Kushner, testified

eral Merrick Garland said "anyone" would be held accountable.

'We will hold accountable anyone who was criminally responsible for attempting to interfere with the transfer, legitimate, lawful transfer of power from one administration to the next," Garland said.

The former President declared the election as fraudulent "right out of the box on election night before there was any potential of looking at the evidence," former U.S. Attorney William Barr said in a taped deposition played by Committee members in June.

Matt Morgan, the Trump campaign's general counsel, provided a videotaped deposition in which he noted that "the law firms were not comfortable making arguments that (lawyer and advisor) Rudy Giuliani was making publicly" about election fraud.

One lawmaker described Giuliani as "apparently inebriated." At the same time, Trump's

"I'm thrilled we were finally able to pass this historic, once-in-a-generation investment in our country's future that will lower costs for Georgians, create clean energy jobs and reduce the deficit all at the same time," said Georgia Democratic Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock.

'I'm especially proud the legislation includes two provisions I introduced to cap insulin costs for Medicare patients at \$35 a month and to limit the cost of prescription drugs for seniors. This bill will strengthen health care access and lower health care costs for people across Georgia."

Warnock said the legislation would make a real change in people's lives.

"From saving seniors money by allowing Medicare to directly negotiate drug prices, to expanding vital health care subsidies, to greening the economy, this legislation will make a lasting impact on Georgians' lives," Warnock stated.

Experts and economists said the Inflation Reduction Act would save American households thousands of dollars.

"This bill will reduce the cost of prescription drugs, make health insurance more affordable, cap out-of-pocket costs, reduce your energy bill, reduce the federal deficit, and bring down inflation,"

Florida Democratic Rep. Val Demings said.

"As the daughter of a maid and a janitor, every dollar mattered in our household, and I'll always fight to protect working families.

Demings said the deal builds on work she did in the House to allow Medicare to negotiate the cost of prescription drugs, bring down energy costs, and create significant new jobs by fighting climate change.

'Senate Republicans tried and failed to block this legislation because it takes on their biggest backers: prescription drug companies, fossil fuel companies, and billionaire tax cheats," Demings remarked.

"I'm going to put Florida families first and support policies to bring down costs for working people even if it cuts into the profit margins of these special interests."

Senate Republicans, all of whom opposed the package, lashed out.

"This is not about inflation reduction. This is all about Democrats spending on things they want to spend money on," Utah GOP Sen. Mitt Romney asserted.

"It's another taxing and spending bill," he insisted.

Biden said he ran for president promising to make government work for working families again, and that is what this bill does.

"This bill caps seniors' out-ofpocket spending for prescription drugs at \$2000 per year - no matter what their drug bills would otherwise be, seniors will not have to spend more than \$2,000," Biden stated

"Additionally, 13 million Americans, covered under the Affordable Care Act, will see their health insurance premiums reduced by \$800." Biden continued:

"This bill tackles inflation by lowering the deficit and lowering costs for regular families. This bill also makes the largest investment ever in combatting the existential crisis of climate change.

"It addresses the climate crisis and strengthens our energy security, creating jobs manufacturing solar panels, wind turbines, and electric vehicles in America with American workers. In addition, it lowers families' energy costs by hundreds of dollars each year.

"Finally, it pays for all this by establishing a minimum corporate tax so that our richest corporations start to pay their fair share. It does not raise taxes on those making under \$400,000 a year – not one cent."

Speaking at a press conference on Thursday, Attorney General Merrick Garland said the charges include two counts of deprivation of civil rights against Hankison, who allegedly fired 10 shots through a window and glass door along the side of Taylor's Louisville apartment.

The Department of Justice also confirmed that Jaynes, Goodlett and Meany are being charged for conspiracy for violating Taylor's Fourth cover-up afterward.

The Philadelphia Inquirer reports that Raymond Thompson, 34, is being held without bail after turning himself into police custody over the weekend. He is charged with killing Ashley Lockhart, 32, in a vicious knife attack inside the Honda Odyssey on the 5300 block of Chestnut Street around 8:30 a.m. Saturday.

Police found Lockhart's body with multiple stab wounds to the body, and one to her face, Fox 29 reports. Thompson told detectives he stabbed Lockhart because he believed she was cheating on him.

Thompson admitted that after he stabbed Lockhart and left her lifeless body in the van's passenger seat, he took the Market-Frankford line to Kensington to use heroin before he called the police to turn himself in.

Assistant District Attorney Joanne Pescatore confirmed that Lockhart had filed a Protection



From Abuse order against Thompson, but the two were believed to be living together.

Lockhart's family has started GoFundMe page that has surpassed their initial \$30,000 goal.

"Ashley was an amazing Mother, dedicated working Mother and devoted Mother," the page states. "She loved all of her children and devoted her time energy and made sacrifices for them that they will forever remember."

The GoFundMe page is ask-

send Lockhart's six daughters off to school and ensure they're not separated after the tragic loss of their mother.

"As this is extremely difficult to process, and unimaginable to even begin to try and move forward, we the family would like to maintain the momentum for the girls," the page shared. "They are returning and their every day essentials are important for us to make sure they aren't lacking, as Ashley did."

Philadelphia woman wanted for shooting

23-year-old Jhayden Gunter in the head

old Jhayden Gunter is in critical condition after twice being shot in the head in Philadelphia on July 31. According to CBS Philly, Gunter was shot on the 2200 block of North Darien Street at approximately 9:45 a.m. after picking up her boyfriend.

Gunter was shot after she and her boyfriend reportedly stopped at a corner store to get a cold beverage. As Gunter waited inside her vehicle, her boyfriend went inside where he got into an argument with a woman he knew, 24-yearold Keyshlyne Patterson. Patterson allegedly followed him outside before shooting Gunter two times in the head and Gunter's boyfriend in the arm and ear. The police were reportedly in the area and heard the gunshots before rushing to the scene. Gunter was taken to Temple University Hospital where

she underwent two emergency surgeries to remove part of her skull to reduce her brain swelling.

Gunter graduated from West Chester University just last year with a major in juvenile psychology and had been at her job for a non-profit in Philadelphia as a case worker for less than two weeks when she was shot, according to her mother, Heather Morris.

'Everyone that knows Jhayden will tell you she is the bubbly party girl whose smile is infectious every time she smiles," Morris said. "Ít makes you smile even if you're in a bad mood. She'll do anything for anyone."

Police used surveillance footage to help identify Patterson, who the police say is considered armed and dangerous. She is wanted for attempted murder.

Morris is thankful that the police heard the shots and were able to get her daughter to the hospital auickly



"Thank God they got my daughter as quickly as they could to Temple Hospital, which probably saved her life," said Morris. "It's sickening to me. I can't begin to describe, I don't know if I'm going to get my daughter back and I don't know in what shape she'll be if I do get her back."

Man who recorded Ahmaud Arbery's killing sentenced to 35 years in prison

pdate (August 8, 2022): William "Roddie" Bryan, the liam "Roddie" Bryan face life senthird man involved in the killing of Ahmaud Arbery, was sentenced to 35 years in prison for a hate crime involving the fatal chase, according to AP News.

Bryan's sentencing is less than the life sentences Gregory and Travis McMichael received on Monday.

Bryan recorded a video of Ar-bery's killing and was previously sentenced to life with a possibility of parole for his involvement in the murder.

Update (August 8, 2022): Gregory McMichael has been sentenced to life in prison plus seven years for a hate crime in Ahmaud Arbery's death, The Washington Post reports.

Greg was previously sentenced to life in prison without parole for Arbery's death.

Hé, alongside his son Travis McMichael, was convicted of attempted kidnapping, a weapons violation and violently interfering with Arbery's right to use a public street because he was Black.

Original (August 8, 2022): Travis McMichael was sentenced to life in prison plus 10 years for federal hate crime charges in connection to the killing of Ahmaud Arbery, The Washington Post reports.

36-year-old's attorney filed a memorandum indicating that her client has received threats and could face imminent harm if sent to a Georgia state prison.

Since being in custody, he has received around "800 threats," including people who "are 'waiting for him, that he should not go into the yard, and that correctional officers have promised a willingness (whether for pay or for free) to keep certain doors unlocked and backs turned to allow inmates to harm him," the memo stated, according to CNN.

"His concern is that he will promptly be killed upon delivery to the state prison system for service of that sentence: He has received numerous threats of death that are credible in light of all circumstances, and the government has a pending investigation into the Georgia DOC's ability to keep inmates safe in a system where murder rates have tripled," the memo continued.

With extremism on the rise in republican party, Kansas voters turn out to preserve abortion rights

ed flags are flying for democracy and democratic values. We need to pay attention to the threats—and also to signs that we can work together to preserve our freedoms.

This summer's primary elections are making it clear that our rights and freedoms are threatened by the rising power of extremists within the Republican Party.

Consider the August 2 pri- procedures." maries in Arizona. President Joe

Biden's 2020 victory in the state sent many Arizona supporters of former President Donald Trump down a deep hole of lies and conspiracy theories about the election. They engineered a ridiculous "audit" that stirred up election-deniers from across the country but failed to undermine Biden's victory.

Responsible Republicans defended the election and its outcome, but on August 2, they were outvoted by Trump's troops. Mark Finchem, who claims against all evidence that the election was stolen from Trump, won the nomination to be secretary of state.

He has called for the 2020 election to be decertified. He wants to get rid of early voting and restrict voting by mail—and give legislators the power to override voters. Finchem, who was at the Capitol on Jan. 6, is a member of the Oath Keepers, the far-right group whose members were involved in planning and leading the assault. A state Republican consultant told The Atlantic,

"I would absolutely expect Finchem to both bend the meaning of laws and throw up roadblocks to the normal election

Arizona Republicans have also nominated Blake Masters for the U.S. Senate. Masters' campaign was backed and funded by far-right billionaire Peter Thiel, who has openly said he no longer believes in democracy. Masters has blamed gun violence on "Black people." His campaign has generated excitement among the White nationalist crowd that was energized by Trump.

The governor's primary is close, but as I wrote this column the day after the election, it appeared that Trump endorsee Kari Lake will win the Republican nomination. Lake, an election conspiracy advocate, calls President Biden "illegitimate" and has said that if she wins, she will instruct the attorney general to seize all voting equipment in the state.

Arizona is also home to politicians who openly embrace White nationalists, including Rep. Paul Gosar and state Sen. Wendy Rogers, who both won their primaries.

Othere xtremists have picked up Republican nominations this summer, including election conspiracy theorist Doug Mastriano, who has campaigned with QAnon activists in his bid for governor of

denier Dan Cox for governor of Maryland; Confederate sympathizer Michael Peroutka for attorney general of Maryland, who has said laws passed by the state legislature are illegitimate because in his eyes, legislators broke God's law by embracing marriage equality; and Big Lie promoter Kristina Karamo for secretary of state in Michigan. The list goes on—too many to

name in a single column.

This is bad news. In a political system dominated by two political parties, it is dangerous to have one party taken over by the kind of truth-rejecting, voter-suppressing, authoritarianism-embracing people who are still driven by the same lies and rage that fueled the Jan. 6 attack on our country.

But Trumpists aren't winning all their races. We have seen examples of courageous Republicans standing up to the Trump mob.

And voters in Kansas gave us another big bright spot-on Aug. 2, when they rejected an anti-choice referendum by more than 20 points.

After the Supreme Court's hardright majority overturned Roe v. Wade, anti-choice legislators have rushed to pass more extreme an-

Pennsylvania; Trumpist election ti-abortion bills targeting health care workers and even friends and family who help someone needing abortion care. Those bills represent the wishes of powerful religious-right groups that have a lot of influence in the Republican Party, but they don't represent the public, which overwhelmingly supports access to abortion.

Given a choice about whether to strip abortion-rights protections out of the state constitution and give legislators a green light to pass a ban, Kansas voters overwhelmingly voted no.

That victory for privacy, freedom, and bodily autonomy was driven by huge voter turnout and the organizers who worked to achieve it. It is a promising sign that many Americans can be motivated to vote this year by the Supreme Court's harmful embrace of a restrictive and regressive social agenda.

Let's make it so.



WHO IS DR. **BARBARA ANN TEER?**

Dr. Barbara Ann Teer was an American writer/producer/teacher/actress and social visionary who died in 2008 at the age of 71. In 1968, she founded Harlem's National Black Theatre, currently located in the Village of Harlem, which was the first revenue-generating Black theatre in the United States. Born in Illinois to parents who were educators and community leaders, she graduated with a bachelor's degree in dance education from the University of Illinois.

Teer went on to study dance in Paris and Berlin before settling in New York City and pursuing a

career as a professional dancer. She toured with many big dance companies and made her Broadway debut in 1961 as dance captain in the award-winning musical Kwamina.

After a knee injury in 1962, she became interested in theatre and had a successful acting career, performing in Broadway, television, film and other theatre productions. However, she always hated the lack of representation and negative stereotypes - which drove her to form the National Black Theatre.

Teer and the theatre was committed to social change within African-American communities, and she also developed her own methodology which was taught there called "TEER: The Technology of Soul."

according to the original post thread. However, the pictures immediately went viral when he later shared them on social media, Hip Hop Wired reports.

"There aren't many options for someone like me..." he captioned one photo. He included images of him driving a car a la Driving Ms. Daisy, laying in a bed while in the big house, and holding a platter of fruits. Yet, the piece de resistance is when BisFitty appears at the end of the staircase as his shocked co-worker realizes his costume at the mansion's party, according to Hip Hop Wired.

The fallout within the company for this tone-deaf event was swift and the employee received a promotion while the individual who organized the event was

terminated. "In the end, the boss canceled the party, and the CEO, who was supposed to be at the party, never showed up. The reason they gave for canceling the party was 'inclement weather," and, while it [did] rain, and the party [was] supposed to be outside, the location had more than enough space inside for there to be some sort of contingency plan. It's also a bit odd that the CEO canceled, as far as I know, he isn't allergic to rain. My thoughts? I think the climate was just a bit... dark for him."



The girl's father made his own Facebook post claiming his daughter was choked by Medlock and called him for help, NY Post reports.



A ttendees of the African American Film Festival at Martha's Vineyard received quite the surprise when former President Barack Obama and former First Lady Michelle Obama made an appearance on Aug. 5. According to Variety, the Obamas were on hand to discuss their new documentary on Netflix, Descendant.

Descendant is directed by Margaret Brown through the Obamas' production company, Higher Ground Productions and tells the story of the last known slave ship to bring people from Africa to the U.S., the Clotilda. The film, which won the creative vision U.S. special jury award at Sundance, focuses on the descendants of the Clotilda in Africatown, Alabama.

The Obamas were introduced by one of the documentary's executive producers, Questlove, and spoke for approximately 15 minutes about the film while noting the importance of revealing Black history that is frequently untold.

"When we screened this... the Rances have we looked at it and immediately stories that too thought, 'This is why we're doing lost in the flow Wigher Ground.' Because what we believe that we know about our history as matter," he said.

Black people, we don't talk about nothing," said the former First Lady. "We can't get anything out of our elders, can we? We don't know anything. Our mothers don't talk about menopause, nobody knows about why grandma and grandpa got divorced," she said.

"We just don't talk. And there's a lot of psychology around that, but what this film reminds us of is the power that our stories have. And we have to tell that truth."

Mr. Obama spoke of the power of storytelling and praised the founders of the Martha's Vineyard African American Film Festival, Stephanie Rance and Floyd Rance.

"When we left the White House, Michelle and I talked about the things we wanted to do post-presidency. We've got a lot of stuff going on, but one of the things that we learned both when we were campaigning for office and taking office was the importance of stories and who tells stories and what stories are valid and what stories are discounted," he said. "And it's one of the powers of this festival, and the work that the Rances have done is to lift up stories that too often have been lost in the flow of time. Because we believe that everybody's stories

Star-studded voting rights celebration encourages 10m more registered Black voters

he Transformative Justice Coalition (TJC) and the National Newspaper Publishers Asso-

Ciation (NNPA) joined the Rainbow Push Coalition and others at a star-studded celebration of the 57th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

The all-star program presented what organizers called a tremendous opportunity to educate the public regarding the significance of the Voting Rights Act and the dangerous threats from the Supreme Court.

Held at the Thurgood Marshall Center Trust in Washington D.C.'s historic Shaw District, the event also highlighted the "anti-democracy forces" that continue to threaten voting rights around the country.

Participants included the Rev. Jesse Jackson, TJC President Dr. Barbara Arnwine and Board Chair Daryl Jones, National Urban League President Marc Morial, NNPA President, and CEO Dr. Benjamin F. Chavis Jr., Congresswoman Maxine Waters (D-Calif.), Sen. Cory Booker (D-N.J.), Dr. William Barber II, and Black Voters Matter Fund co-founder Latosha Brown.

"We've got to make sure our Generation Z and Millennials don't, as Malcolm X said, fall for the okey-doke," Dr. Chavis exclaimed to the large gathering outside the Thurgood Marshall Trust Building.

"That they don't fall for misinformation. Our history shows that if we continue fighting for freedom, we will win freedom," Dr. Chavis said.

"If we continue to fight for voting rights, we will win voting rights."

Morial called out the evils of misinformation and voter suppression.

"There's an effort to suppress and dilute our votes, but we cannot be thwarted, frustrated, or deterred," Morial asserted.

"Only determination and perseverance will help us ensure ... because a lot is on the line. The violent insurrection threatened to bring this nation to its knees on January 6. But unfortunately, there are some in this country who don't believe in representative democracy. So don't believe in the universality of the right to vote."

Intending to register 10 million more Black voters before the midterm elections, Arnwine, Dr. Chavis, and others urged the crowd in D.C. and those watching via a livestream to join the crusade.

"We struggle, and we sacrifice not for ourselves," Dr. Chavis asserted. "We struggle and sacrifice and go to the frontlines, and the best feeling in the world is to go to sleep at night and wake up in the morning knowing that you've done something for your freedom, for your right to vote.

"Our sleeves are rolled up. We will have votercades and do everything we can to ensure that 10 million more Black people are registered to vote."



Giles Croft's poignantly directed 'The Kite Runner' is a tour de force

fter two years on the New York Times Best Seller List and a huge hit for two seasons on London's West End, "The Kite Runner" officially opened Thursday, July 21, 2022 at Broadway's Hayes Theater (240 West 44th Street, NYC). Hailed as one of the best-loved and most highly acclaimed novels of our time, "The Kite Runner" is based on Khaled Hosseini's internationally best-selling novel about heart and home and is adapted by Matthew Spangler and poignantly directed by Giles Crofton. The play began performances Wednesday, July 6 and opened Thursday, July 21, for a limited engagement through Sunday, October 30, 2022. "The Kite Runner" is steeped in cultural incongruities and the performances will grip your soul with its reality check on cultural nuances and race relations. "The Kite Runner" is a manifestation of Broadway excellence. Riveting!

"The Kite Runner" is a haunting tale of friendship spanning cultures and continents, which follows one man's journey to confront his past and find redemption. Afghanistan is a divided country on the verge of war and two childhood friends are about to be torn apart. It's a beautiful afternoon in Kabul and the skies are full of the excitement and joy of a kite flying tournament. But neither of the boys can foresee the terrible incident which will shatter their lives forever.


