Brown U. acquires writings, artwork of incarcerated ex-Black **Panther Mumia Abu-Jamal**

rown University has acquired the personal papers and art-work of incarcerated former Black Panther, Mumia Abu-Jamal.

The Ivy League school obtained the documents in an effort "to advance research on incarceration," the school announced on Wednesday. The records, papers, and art pieces will be held in a collection at the John Hay Library.

The collection is in partnership with Brown's Pembroke Center and also includes related personal papers from historian Johanna Fernández — a 1993 Brown grad-uate and longtime advocate for Abu-Jamal. The documents were acquired through a trust for an undisclosed price and include more than 60 boxes of materials spanning the years 1981 to 2020, AP News reports.

The former journalist is serving a life sentence without the possibility of parole for the fatal shooting of Philadelphia Police Officer Daniel Faulkner on Dec. 9, 1981. Witnesses testified that Abu-Jamal shot and killed Faulkner while he was arresting his brother


during a traffic stop.

But for decades, Abu-Jamal has maintained his innocence. Prior to the shooting, in the 1970s and early 1980s, Abu-Jamal worked as a radio reporter, where he covered MOVE and the organization's tension with police, and highlighted other issues related to racism, systemic oppression, and politics, as noted by Billy Penn.

By the time he was on trial for Faulkner's murder, Abu-Jamal was labeled a MOVE sympathizer and judged for wearing his hair in dreadlocks, according to reports. Abu-Jamal's incarceration and sentencing remain at the center of fierce debates around racial injustice, the death penalty, and the flawed justice system.



Historic climate legislation called a game changer for **Black America**

onsensus on climate provisions marks a historic step in the right direction for tackling the climate crisis that impacts Black people and people of color at disproportionate rates, the NAACP noted following Senate passage of the Inflation Reduction Act.

In a statement, the NAACP said Black and Brown communities have higher exposure to carbon emissions and all emission sectors.

Therefore, financial investment in climate issues and plans to reduce toxic emissions would be a vital step toward climate justice, the civil rights organization stated.

As the U.S. House of Representatives takes up the more than \$700 billion economic package that includes healthcare, tax, and climate change, White House officials and climate justice activists said the bill would greatly benefit people of color.

It puts the money with the mission. It's a large amount of money, and the task in front of us is huge," Felicia Davis, the co-founder of HBCU Green Fund.

Davis and White House Deputy National Climate Director Ali Żaidi joined the National Newspaper Publishers Association's "Let It Be Known" to discuss the historic piece of legislation.

'The challenge has always been accessing the resources to do whatever. We all would love solar panels and drive electric cars," Davis stated.

"This legislation gives lower-income families access to those things, and it will make resources available if you're buying new or used electric vehicles. Also, the funds are now available for small businesses who might want to install electric charging stations."

family-sustaining wages and significantly reduce or eliminate pollution.

"It's really important for fam-ilies right now. On average, this legislation will help cut annual energy bills by hundreds of dollars by helping families access technologies that are often out of reach, especially for low-to-moderate income families," Zaidi continued.

"Things like solar panels on your roof, a storage unit in your garage, switching to electric heat, or an electric stove. It's often hard for people to afford that upfront cost, but the legislation provides rebates and tax credits of up to \$14,000 for low-to-moderate income families.

Zaidi called the legislation "a big deal."

'It makes it a lot more affordable for families. The equivalent price of charging electric vehicles is \$1.20 per gallon, a huge shift that will save money," Zaidi asserted.

"Also, by creating jobs that folks can work in this industry, we've put

addition, he said it would create rebates that will help Americans expand the use of technology and the requirements for an apprenticeship. People will be able to raise a family with this income."

The bill includes a minimum 15% tax on most corporations that make more than \$1 billion a year in profits and \$369 billion for climate action – the largest investment in the issue in American history.

Overall, the bill will allow the U.S. to cut the nation's carbon emissions by 40 percent in less than a decade.

Biden slowly winning LBJ, FDR like praise as legislative victories mount

s Donald Trump told New York prosecutors that he'd invoke his Fifth Amendment rights against self-incrimination, President Joe Biden sat behind a desk at the White House, where he signed into law the PACT Act, legislation that expands health care benefits for veterans who developed illnesses because of exposure to toxic substances at U.S. military bases.

can do for the countless men and women, many of whom may be in this room, who suffered toxic exposure while serving their country," Biden stated.

'This new law matters. It matters a lot."

Facing unrelenting criticism because of high gas prices, inflation, and his low-approval rating, Biden has built a track record that has gone almost overlooked.

If he continues the string of success he has enjoyed in getting his mandate through Congress, historians might revisit Biden's presidency as one of the most consequential in American history.

Despite Republican leadership vowing to do all they can to stunt Biden's agenda, the president has pushed through game-changing legislation like the PACT Act, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill, the American Rescue Plan, and the CHIPS and Science Act.

He's displayed a steady hand in returning affordability to gas prices, succeeded in expanding NATO, and monthly jobs reports continue to show increases.

You can say what you will, that Biden is too old, he's not a deal maker, he's sleepy Joe, or whatever, but he's getting things done even though he's not getting the credit he deserves," Stacey Rouse, a D.C.based utility worker opined.

"It's funny. When the other guy [Trump] was in office, you heard so much talk and bragging about what he's doing, and the media blanketed him with coverage," Rouse asserted.

"Now, you got the F.B.I. raiding Trump. He's pleading the Fifth at depositions, and Biden is conducting business the way you would want your president to conduct himself. I think he's accomplished so much, but we don't hear about it. I think ten years or so from now, and people will look back and realize what a good president this man is."

Rouse's colleague, Scott Anthony, agreed.

"I was a skeptic because that thing about sleepy Joe seemed true," Anthony said.

"But, it seems other people are doing the sleeping because Biden is getting things done and he's just not getting the credit."

Upon signing the CHIPS and Science Act on August 10, Biden also peeked into the future and prognosticated what historians and others might determine.

"I honest to God believe that The PACT Act is the least we 50, 75, 100 years from now, people who will look back on this week, they'll know that we met this moment," Biden declared.

An acronym for Creating Helpful Incentives to Produce Semiconductors, the CHIPS Act provides \$10 billion to invest in regional technology hubs across the country and a 25% investment tax credit for expenses for manufacturing of semiconductors and other equipment.

The bill earmarks about \$100 billion in spending over five years on scientific research and \$80 billion for the National Science Foundation.

Those early aspirations to being another Franklin D. Roosevelt and Lyndon B. Johnson, the ones that felt like so much hubris in the past few months, are being heard again in the halls of the West Wing and the Capitol," Peter Baker wrote about Biden for the New York Times.

"House aides argue that the string of congressional victories capped by the package of climate, health and tax provisions that finally cleared the Senate - compares favorably to the twoyear legislative record of most any other modern president, even perhaps F.D.R. and L.B.J.,' Baker penned.

Politico noted that "Biden has never had a more productive stretch of his presidency," with wins stacking atop wins at a most opportune time.

'Already the victories have enlivened beleaguered supporters and injected new optimism across the West Wing," Politico reported.

"Aides describe a burst of energy in the executive mansion Biden and his staff suddenly find themselves with a host of successes to talk about, from the reconciliation bill to the China competitiveness bill, from legislation to give health benefits to veterans harmed by toxic burn pits to a robust jobs market."

Racist Jim Crow provisions are alive and suppressing Black votes in Mississippi

here's been a new wave of voter suppression laws that have become more prevalent ever since Black people exercised their right to vote in record numbers during the 2020 Presidential election.

Republican-led states such as Texas, Florida, and Georgia are

just reimagining voting suppression tactics from an old playbook of poll taxes and Jim Crow laws. That's abundantly clear from what is happening in Mississippi right now. According to the Mississippi Free Press, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has allowed an 1890 Jim-Crow era voting law to continue.

Yes, in 2022, remnants of Jim

Crow are still allowed to exist in southern states. While the primarily conservative court conceded the Mississippi law was steeped in racism, they believed the state had done enough since then to dilute the law's impact on Black Americans

Just as recently as April, Mississippi Gov. Tate Reeves vetoed a bill that would have overturned this provision. No wonder Mississippi has never elected a Black candidate for office, despite having the largest Black population in the country.

In 1890, newly emancipated Black Americans were making progress using their right to vote. At the same time, a white supremacist-dominated Mississippi legislative body was working to stop that by any means necessary. They got together and constructed parts of the state constitution that added crimes they believed mostly Black people committed in order to justify rescinding their right to vote forever and explicitly keep white rule in place.



Louisville corrections officer fired after making video mocking Breonna Taylor's death: 'We killed that B****'

A fter making an offensive video that makes fun of the police killing of Breonna Taylor, a corrections officer in Louisville, Kentucky, was terminated by the Louisville Metro Department of Corrections last week.

According to The Washington Post, Turhan Knight, a corrections officer for the LMDC since 2018, was fired from his job due to insensitive remarks made in a video. The incident occurred in front of an LMPD display at the Kentucky State Fair.

The video, which he tried to play off as a recruitment video for the Louisville Metro Police Department, mocks the 2020 killing of Taylor by the recently indicted police officers involved in the controversy.

According to WHAS 11, in the video, Knight says,

"Answer the call, be a part of a great, great police department. Never mind what happened to Breonna Taylor, we killed that B**ch. Do you want to be able to support your family, do you want to kill people and get off for it? Join Louisville Metro Police Department."

In an emailed statement to The Washington Post, Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer said:

"There is zero excuses for his insensitivity. He has brought great shame upon Metro Corrections and all of the Louisville metro government. I deeply apologize to the family of Breonna Taylor and all of the hard-working and ethical employees of the Louisville metro government. One person will not tarnish the good work we attempt



to do on behalf of our residents." The head of the corrections officers' union, president of Kentucky FOP Lodge 77, Daniel Johnson, agreed with the decision made by LMDC. They will not oppose his termination and stated the "termination was absolutely justified and was the right deci-

sion." Knight also made a statement as he apologized to the Taylor family.

"I want to first apologize to the Mother, Boyfriend and Family of Breonna Taylor because I never meant to compound or further remind them of the tragedy that has taken place. And I also apologize to my family, friends, the community & my church member's because I knew better and I ask them to forgive me. I understand the severity of my actions and why I am currently in this position and the insensitive comments I made in a joking way should not have been made AT ALL."



That was quick! 3 Arkansas officers suspended following video of violent arrest of white man

S ometimes, I notice that when a Black person or suspect is resisting arrest, the officer then uses excessive or fatal force based on the behavior of that individual. Then, when people cry out "racism!" and "police brutality!" it's always met with the same recycled response, "Well, they should've complied." But suddenly, for a white suspect in Arkansas, the tables have turned.

A video went viral of two Crawford County sheriff's deputies and a Mulberry police officer pinning 27-year-old Randal Worcester down on the ground, per 4029TV News. They slammed his head onto the concrete and punched him repeatedly. The Crawford County Sheriff's Office released a statement on Facebook announcing the three involved were suspended and currently under investigation.

The comments under the statement cried for accountability and justice, even while Worcester was labeled a wanted suspect and was violent toward the officers.

Read more on the incident from CNN:

Worcester is charged with second-degree battery, resisting arrest, possessing an instrument of crime, criminal trespass, criminal mischief, terroristic threatening and first- and second-degree assault, Arkansas State Police said.

Worcester allegedly threatened a gas station clerk in a neighboring town, Crawford County Sheriff Jimmy Damante told CNN affiliate KHBS. When he was spotted in Mulberry, Worcester was initially

cooperative, but then tried to attack the officers, leading to the confrontation seen in the video, Damante told the station.

It was unclear if Worcester suffered any serious injury. The suspect was examined at a hospital and booked into jail, while a deputy received minor head injuries during the altercation, the sheriff told KHBS.

CNN's law enforcement analysts viewed the footage of the incident and agreed the officers went overboard.

"-it is very, very hard to argue that what you're seeing — the sort of punches and the kneeing him in the back and slamming his head ... on the ground. That is not acceptable, normal, standard police use of force under really any circumstances," said analyst Andrew McCabe via CNN.

n Aug. 15 on what would have been his 37th birthday, the late Grammy-nominated rapper, entrepreneur and philanthropist Nipsey Hussle was honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

He is the 11th rapper to have a Walk of Fame star.

Hussle's fans, family and friends from the industry attended the ceremony.

"I think I speak for the entire city of LA when I say that we've known Nip was destined for greatness," said Lauren London, Hussle's longtime girlfriend who spoke at the ceremony. "This moment only amplifies that for us. Nip would have been honored by this moment. I think he would want everyone to remember that you can't get to what's possible unless you commit to moving forward. It doesn't mean forgetting where you come from, but it requires acknowledging the reality you were born into and the power you have to change that reality for the better."

Lós Angeles City Councilmember Marqueece Harris-Dawson declared Aug. 15, Nipsey Hussle Day in Los Angeles.

"Today, on his born day, we finally got him a star on the walk of fame. Rest in Paradise Nip" Assemblymember Isaac Bryan (D-Los Angeles) a guest in attendance at the 30-minute ceremony posted on Twitter.

Born Airmiess Joseph Asghedom, Hussle was a Los Angeles native who rose to fame in the mid-2000s. After gaining notoriety locally following the release of a string of mixtapes, his gritty sound and inspirational spirit captivated listeners' imaginations. He became more famous as he sold physical copies of his mixtapes for \$100 each, an unheard-of strategy given the music was available digitally for free. This declaration of selfworth caught the attention of his fans and the music industry at large. Jay-Z famously bought 100 copies of the mixtape in a show of respect and support.

Hussle's crowning musical achievement was the release of his 2018 album 'Victory Lap'. The effort received a Best Rap Album Grammy nomination in 2019. In 2020, at the 62nd Grammy Awards, he posthumously earned three more nominations and took home two wins for Best Rap Performance and Best Rap/Sung Performance.

His impact on the community grew with the opening of his Marathon clothing store in the heart of the Crenshaw commercial district. The store gave customers access to exclusive music along with the clothing. Hussle would go on to buy the entire shopping mall that surrounded the Marathon clothing store, in which he invested in





STEM technology workspaces and housed other local entrepreneurs.

housed other local entrepreneurs. On March 21, 2019, Hussle was killed outside of his Marathon store by Eric Holder who last month was found guilty of first-degree murder. Following his death, there was an outpouring of tributes. People in his community, across California and around the country, honored his life with murals, vigils and other remembrances, reflecting the impact Hussle had on California and the hip hop community worldwide.

While the Marathon store has closed, the location remains a memorial to Hussle where fans pay daily tribute to his memory. There are plans to open a second store on Melrose Avenue. However, no date has been set for its opening.

Writer and sports media personality Justin Tinsley narrated an ESPN 30 for 30 special about Hussle and his close relationship with athletes and the sports world, particularly LA Sports.

"That star on the Walk of Fame is symbolic of so much," said Tinsley. "Nipsey is one of those people who will always be remembered — yes, as an incredible rapper — but even more than that, he was a man who had a vision for himself and his people. He put that into action and the result of which will keep his name alive for generations of Black folk. That's so beautiful and it's inspiring that he cared so much to do everything he did. But that star is also symbolic of

everything we lost with him too. Everything he was yet to think of. Everything he was supposed to do and accomplish."

Tinsley said he feels the sadness following the senseless murder of Hussle still lingers amongst his supporters but that the joy, pride and motivation he brought to many cannot be forgotten.

"Losing Nipsey in the physical sense will never truly make sense. It's something God — or whomever you pray to — can truly answer. But it's such a blessing that we were all given the time to be impacted by him whether up close and personal or from afar. And through all the pain that's still there — and will always be there — that's how we got to look at it. Grief is a very real emotion. But it shouldn't be the only one when we talk about Nipsey Hussle"

The concept of "The Marathon" was a staple in Hussle's music. Persevering through obstacles to reach your goal and enduring the pain that inevitably comes when striving for greatness. At the conclusion of London's Walk of Fame induction speech, she referenced this concept and left a message for everyone visiting Hussle's monument.

"Whenever you're in the City of Angels and you see this star, I hope it encourages you to break away from whatever might be holding you back and for you to run your marathon until God says that it is finished."



Although the Detroit native rose to fame as the lead singer of Motown's famous girl group, The Supremes in the 1960s, she took her acclaimed stardom to the next level as a solo sensation which made her a uber star with global appeal. No one does it like Ms. Ross who spins magic on any stage she appears with her beloved distinctive vocals, viva-cious spirit and vibrant designer's gowns. Very few can galvanize fans like her, either! And she never disappoints them putting on a visual extravaganza consisting of stunning gowns and exuding imperial Black elegance. The Diana Ross magic has touched music, fashion, stage, film, and TV. Ms. Ross' international achievements were acknowledged by the prestigious Kennedy Center Honors in Washington D.C. (2007). The National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences bestowed its highest honor, The Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award, in 2012.

Her portrayal of Billie Holiday in the classic film Lady Sings the Blues produced an Oscar nomination and a Golden Globe Award. Starring as an aspiring designer in the 1975 romantic comedy Mahogany, the role was a perfect opportunity to personally sketch and design all the fashion in the timeless film. As a stage actress, she won Broadway's top honor with a Tony Award for her one-woman show, An Evening with Diana Ross. In 2017, the American Music Awards presented Ms. Ross with the Lifetime Achievement Award. In 1993, she earned a Guinness World Record for her success in the United States and United Kingdom by having more hits than any other female artist on the charts with a career total of over 75 hit singles.

Additional career milestones include Induction into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, The Songwriters Hall of Fame, National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences Hero Award, NAACP Entertainer Award, Billboard's Female Entertainer of the Century Award, and The Soul Train Legend Award. Ms. Ross is also one of the few celebrities to have two stars on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. Her voice, described as "honey" and "angelic," has over 100 million streams, downloads and sales around the world.

In what has been described as one of the greatest live concert performances, Diana Ross drew a crowd of over 800,000 people to New York's Central Park on July 21 & 22, 1983. Soon after the show began on July 21, pouring rain and heavy wind threatened to put an end to the show, but she pushed on for much of the set, urging the drenched crowd to remain calm and stay with her. Eventually the storm put an end to the performance, but not before she promised her fans that she would return the next day. True to her word, she performed the entire concert again on July 22nd for the people of New York City.



Ngozi Okaro's Custom Collaborative 2022 collection is fashion that works

ustom Collaborative (CC) is a non-profit entrepreneurship and workforce organization that teaches and inspires low income and immigrant women to design, sew, and sell sustainable fashion and accessories. CC's innovative Executive Director, Ngozi Okaro, is a statuesque and strikingly attractive woman who has always custom ordered fashionable clothes to fit her lifestyle. The daughter of a Black American mother and Nigerian father she stands tall while fashioning herself in the style of her choice for every occasion. Okaro received a bey of compliments wearing fashions by local African designers. At the same time she realized the makers did not charge enough for the quality garments they were producing. Consequently, Okaro was motivated to find a way to provide the knowledge and skills to improve the fabric of their lives that is essential for the BIPOC economies and communities to thrive.

Custom Collaborative's innovative programs give women the opportunity to achieve viable livelihoods in the fashion industry, supporting women's economic independence and being in

control of their work. By learning business practices of the fashion industry and professional design skills, our participants overcome barriers to employment, and ultimately change the economics of the fashion industry. The women who participate in CC's programs come from 23 countries, including the United States: 100% are ambitious women; 80% are im-migrants – first generation; 85% of our students are mothers; 80% of the participants live below the federal poverty level; and 50% live in unstable housing.

Within the last five years, Custom Collaborative has graduated over seventy women who are representative of the BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) immigrant and low-income community. Since 2016, our participants have completed a 14 week program covering the art, craft, and technique of fashion design. CC established a business incubator that offers advanced training in all aspects of the fashion business. Twice a month, we provide a MasterClass, inviting successful industry executives and entrepreneurs to share their personal stories with the inspired women of Custom Collaborative. The two trillion dollar global fashion industry perpetuates humani-




Ngozi Okaro's Custom Collaborative proud graduation class of 2022

tarian and environmental injustice at every level of the supply chain. Racial inequity in education, business and industry continues to persist, leaving BIPÓC and immigrant populations at a disproportionate disadvantage. The dual pandemics of COVID-19 and racial injustice in society have brought to light the immediate need to re-evaluate infrastructures, systems and policies.

Ngozio Okaro advocates for a fashion industry that honors people, planet, and profit. At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, CC's Production Manager designed a fabric mask that aided in unifying the community through social media and Custom Collaborative.org. The sales of the "Unity In the Community" mask has generated income for the women of CC while working from home. They were paid a fair wage and were able to elevate the economics of life for their families. Mask collaborations were created with Mara Hoffman, a celebrated sustainable fashion industry sportswear designer, and Hanky Panky, a women's lace underwear slow fashion manufacturer. NiLu Gift shop in Harlem has supported Custom Collaborative with mask purchases and in store pop ups. The Today Show filmed their story from the classroom at Riverside Church, to the CC Studio on East 124th Street and at NiLu Boutique on Lenox Avenue in February 2020.

In March 2020, the organization successfully transitioned to remote learning and a Cohort 8 graduation on Zoom in June 2020. On August a Minority and Women Owned ness Owner, and AARP Purpose 19,2022,Custom Collaborative is privileged to present Cohort 9's Graduation and Fashion Show, "Design & Flourish", the first in person class and ceremony since March 2020 at Riverside Church. CC was the recipient of a Gucci Grant in 2020 to support their programs. The Garment District Alliance selected Custom Collaborative as one of ten organizations selected to present skills to uphold the footprint of the garment industry with skill training programs and


